The college is equipped with a computerised mechanism for admissions, fee, examinations, library system and teaching departments.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The faculty plays an active role in curriculum development as when on the Boards of Studies of the affiliating university, the statutory body for designing the curriculum. However, the faculty makes utmost efforts to acquaint students with the contemporary trends in their respective academic areas beyond syllabi by stretching the provision of internal assessment. The proposed academic changes are first discussed at the departmental level. The Principal and IQAC are apprised on regular basis.

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### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college has recruited highly qualified and competent teaching faculty to ensure effective and student-centric teaching-learning process. The faculty update their academic knowledge and teaching methodology through participation in various professional development programmes. Latest techniques and teaching aids like ICT, LCD projectors, audio-visual aids, and smart classrooms are adopted. With commitment to the timely completion of the syllabi, the faculty make all-round efforts to improve the academic performance of students.

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

In addition to the regular university examinations, the college conducts various class tests, group discussions, assignments, viva-voce, class seminars, quiz contests and presentations. To monitor the strengths and weakness of students in their syllabi based activities, the faculty remain constantly in touch and provide proper guidance and feedback on one to one basis in addition to the routine classroom sessions. Students are given due opportunity to review their evaluated answer scripts. To make the whole process transparent, students are encouraged to report discrepancies at departmental level for prompt rectification.

### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college has developed a research friendly environment to promote research aptitude among faculty and students. Around 60% of our faculty members are actively engaged in different areas of research. The college organizes national and international seminars from time to time. The faculty members actively participate in seminars/conferences in India and abroad. Many faculty members are pursuing research under Faculty Improvement Programme of UGC. To strengthen the resources and environment for research, the library has subscribed to INFLIBNET for e-resources.

### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has a well maintained and rich library catering to the needs and interests of students and faculty. The modern infrastructure and diversity of its resources carry an imprint of the decades old tradition of constant support extended by the alumni. New books and periodicals are added regularly. To further strengthen the library system, library committee play an active role.

The college has set the agenda to increase the use of ICT to facilitate teaching and learning. Computers with internet facilities have been provided to teaching departments to include computer-aided teaching. Smart boards and LCD projectors are provided in seminar halls and labs which also serve as smart class rooms. To accelerate transition to ICT based teaching-learning, the college has engaged faculty and post-graduate students in workshops and interactive sessions. The department of computer science is playing a key role to achieve this objective.

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The college has an infrastructure which has been developed into a systematic, spacious and modern architecture with vast play grounds as envisioned in master plan by the founders. To address the emerging needs of its well established sports activities, an indoor stadium is being completed with financial support from the UGC. An effective monitoring system through various committees ensures the maintenance and upkeep of infrastructure, facilities and equipments of the college. The college administration ensures timely additions and proper maintenance of the overall infrastructure with a student centric and eco-friendly vision.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The college management ensures a supportive environment and the quality of human resources is constantly improved and upgraded. To recognise the deep rooted tradition of belongingness, the institution has continued with a unique practice of honouring the employees on completing twenty five years of service. Moreover, ample opportunities are provided for the professional progress of teaching and non-teaching staff.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of sanctioned positions for regular faculty and non-teaching staff is done as per the guidelines of the State Government/Affiliating university/UGC. In addition to the recruitment of eighteen Assistant Professors in different subjects in February 2013, the demography of the faculty got another boost in the current year as three Assistant professors joined on regular posts. The non-sanctioned posts were filled up with recruitment of 90 guest faculty and 20 non-teaching staff.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The local industry and manufacturing units are visited to provide exposure to our students and help them develop entrepreneurial outlook. Job training programmes are organised in vocational courses (B.B.A., B.C.A. and PGDCA etc). Department of Commerce, Economics, Physics and Zoology have organised industrial visits for the students at various places.

Various departments have developed linkages and collaborations with industry, scientific, educational and cultural organisations/institutions to provide the students required exposure and career opportunities.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

As the most preferred destination for higher education in the surrounding region, the college has implemented online admission process. This is reflected in the increasing number of applications in different disciplines. As per admission norms, the departments have complete autonomy in admission of students. Admission is based on merit as per the Government norms. Different merit lists are displayed on the notice board as well.

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## ANNEXURE-V

### Best Practices-I

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- **Title of the Practice**

Village Adoption

- **The context that required the initiation of Practice**

The customary practice of NSS units of the college has been to organize annual camps at surrounding villages. The bond with the concerned village normally discontinued once the camp was over. To maintain continuity of initiatives taken and linkage developed with the community life of a particular village, NSS units planned to adopt a village of surrounding location for next three years.

- **Objectives of the Practice**

- To create an environment of community life above caste and gender biases
- To address the rural-urban divide among students
- Awareness about welfare schemes of the govt.
- Cleanliness drive along with campaign for environmental conservation

- **The Practice**

The NSS units of the college which are three in number and comprising boys and girls across faculties and evening-morning session adopted Shergarh village for the next three annual camps. Program Officers of NSS units along with student-volunteers visited the village prior to the camp and after deliberations chalked out the list and sequence of activities to be done. During the camp, volunteers stayed in the govt. school. The major activities done were divided in morning and evening sessions. The forenoon session included discourse by a resource person on a selected issue of the objectives followed by brief discussion. Subsequently, volunteers took up cleanliness and plantation drives in association with the villagers. In the afternoon sessions, issues of caste and gender discrimination were addressed through cultural performances.

- **Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome**

Initial indifference of the village community was overcome with the help of the cultural group of NSS units.

- **Impact of the Practice**

The impact of this practice as envisioned in the objectives have been for both - the villagers as well as the NSS volunteers. Cultural programs followed by open discussions helped in building a bond of trust and mutuality with the villagers. Participation of women as audience in the programs was a major breakthrough. Through awareness campaign and programs the volunteers were able to uncover the male-centric pattern of community life, especially in male-female ratio and education of girl child. School going girls of the village mixed up with girl volunteers of NSS and participated actively in informal discussions on several issues.

- **Resources Required**

- For the camp and its activities, the college provides funds. However, the villagers voluntarily contributed by offering milk and vegetables.

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## Best Practice-II

- **Title of the practice**

Online admissions

- **The context that required the initiation of the practice**

Due to the increasing rush for admission to the college and over six thousand students as actual admits in different faculties and courses, a need was felt to handle the overall admission process in a manner that the manual aspect is reduced and record keeping is simplified.

- **Objectives of the practice**

- To make viable shift to e-governance in a phased manner
- To ensure optimum accuracy, transparency and efficiency

- **The practice**

The college decided to start online admission process with courses in science stream. This initiative of the college was even ahead of the affiliating university. For this, software for online registration along with necessary information was developed. To help applicants, the department of Computer Science worked in coordination with Admission Committee. Student-volunteers of the department of computer science and the supporting staff established special counters with computer-internet facilities. The college administration also contacted some of the local internet cafes and apprised them of the change in mode of admission. A large number of applicants filled up their forms from these cafes and other sources within their reach. As a precautionary measure, the applicants were asked to submit printout of their online form.

- **Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome**

- The software was working on experimental basis and hence, several improvements and updating were required.
- Initially, there was some resistance from applicants and parents. These hurdles were successfully addressed by active participation of faculty, student-volunteers and supporting staff. The software was updated. Enrolled students were given required help and orientation

- **Impact of the Practice**

Initially, this step demanded constant interaction of the department of Computer Science, Admission Committee and the supporting staff. Once kicked off, applicants began to display greater self-reliance and confidence. Given the large number of aspirants for science courses, this process helped a credible and transparent preparation of merits lists, cut offs, deadlines and mechanism of redressing admission related grievances.

- **Resources Required**

Relevant logistics and user friendly software.
